Claude Bourbonnais is a Professor at the Université of Sherbrooke in Canada since 1987. He graduated from U. de Sherbrooke in 1985 for a Ph. D in theoretical condensed matter physics. He spent his postdoctoral years in Laboratoire de Physique des Solides(LPS) d'Orsay in France in 1985-1987. He was a researcher fellow of the NSERC-Canada from 1987-1989 and was appointed as a Chercheur Associé of the CNRS at the LPS of Orsay during 1987-1990. He was an invited professor at LPS of Orsay in 1991, 2000 and 2005, and at Nagoya University in Japan in 2004. His research interests are mainly devoted to the theoretical aspects of the physics of low dimensional conductors and in the mechanism at the origin of superconductivity in organic crystals.
